As I write this, winter is quickly approaching, and the year is coming to a close. Looking back on 2022, like most years, there have been ups and there have been downs.

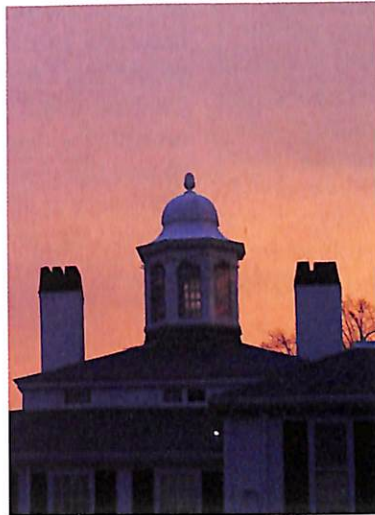

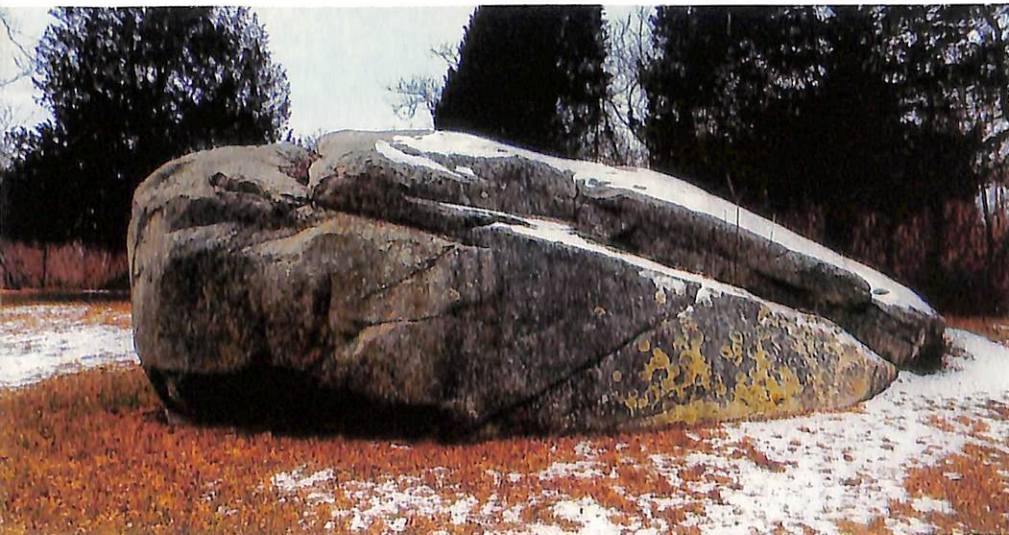

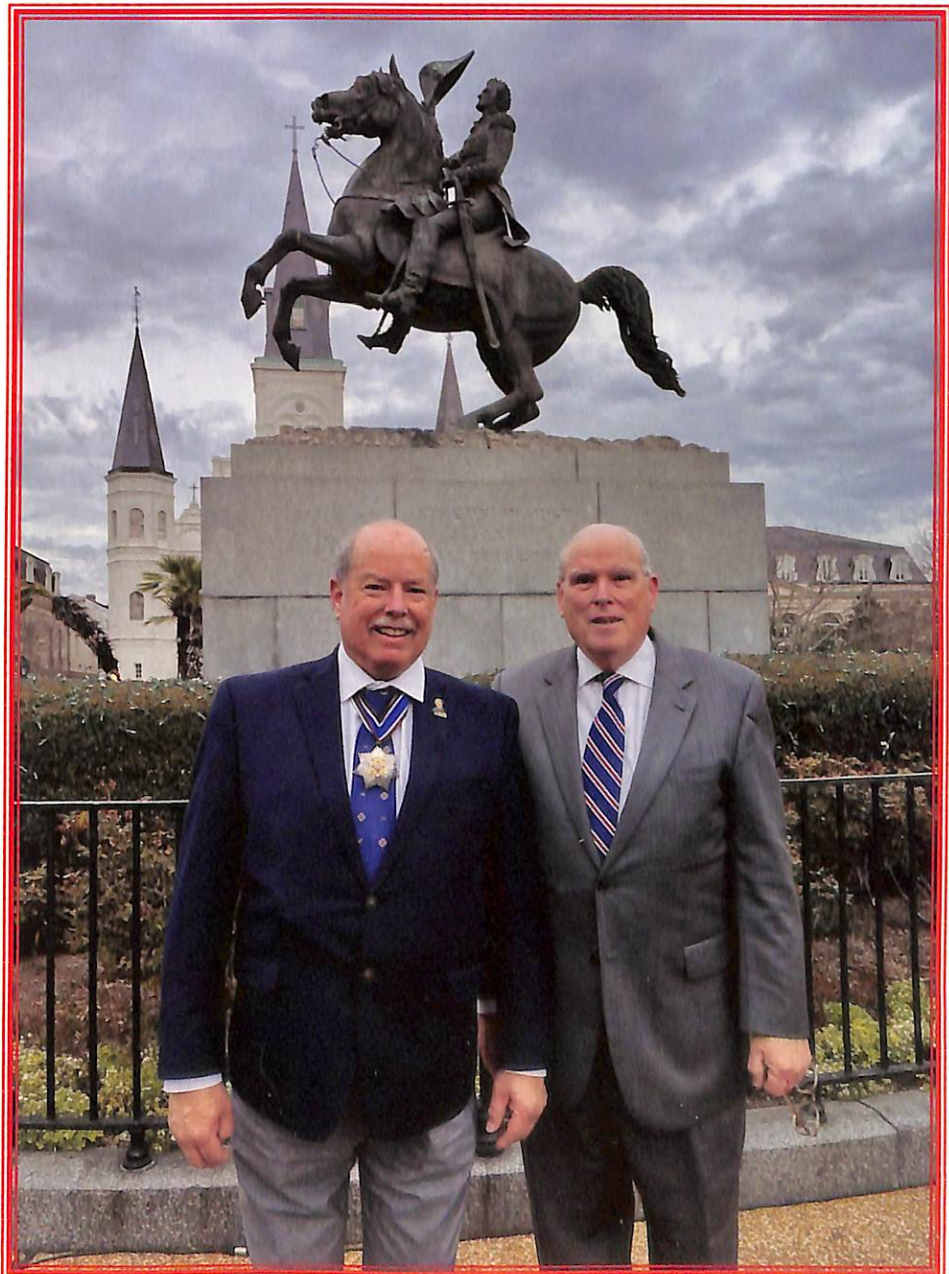
